Unhappy in love and money, Richard Middleton, author of the *Ghost Ship* and of many enduring poems, chloroformed himself to death in Brussels on December 1st, 1911. This collection of 113 letters treasured by his only confidant and friend reveals the alternation of hope and despair in his mind during the whole period from his first struggles in London to the end. They place on record uniquely the tribulations of a poet—one of the strangest personalities in English literature, and light up from the inside that period, now receding in time, the "Edwardian" age, with all its simplicities and profundities which the War has scattered.

UNDER MAGOG

Roazanov, the author of *Solitaria*, has been described by D. H. Lawrence as "the first Russian who has ever said anything to me. And his vision is full of passion, vivid, valid. When Roazanov is wholly awake, and a new man, a risen man, the living and resurrected pagan, then he is a great man and a great seer, and perhaps, as he says himself, the first Russian to emerge." *Fallen Leaves* is a collection of the thoughts of Roazanov, random thoughts falling from his mind like the leaves of the Russian autumn. As an indication, a summing-up and development of the Russian pre-revolutionary mentality, these sombre and passionate moods of Roazanov will be of absorbing interest to all who are not afraid of the darker aspects of the human consciousness.

ISCARIOT, the story of Judas told by CECIL ROTH

The publishers believe, and do not merely hope, that this book will be a "best seller". Never before has an incident of biblical drama been re-told so well—simply, powerfully and with scholarship. The action of Judas in betraying the Master is ascribed to a hopeless, earthly infatuation of the betrayer for Mary of Magdala—and the perfume of her spikenard is maddening in his nostrils at the moment of the Judas kiss. The treatment of religious themes is reverent throughout, both from the Jewish and Christian points of view. The historical setting of the story is exact in detail and convincingly informative. The human tragedy of Judas, ending in Aeldama, is told as an epic of frustration in sacred and profane love.
